2016 Scholarships – Now Accepting Applications**

The Mid-America Chapter of **The Phi Tau Phi Scholastic Honor Society** is pleased to offer four scholarship awards at \$1,000.00 each to qualified undergraduate and graduate students in recognition of their outstanding academic and overall achievements. **Undergraduate students will be given priority in the final selection.**

**Eligibility:**

1. Be a matriculated junior or senior or have achieved at least 60 semester academic credit hours pursuing a degree at an accredited institution of higher education in the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, Texas and Wisconsin during the current academic year.
2. Or a graduate student in an accredited graduate school in the aforementioned states.
3. Have an overall college GPA of 3.5 (4.0 system) or higher.
4. Be of Chinese descent interested in and committed to Chinese heritage and culture.
5. Have not previously received a Phi Tau Phi scholarship award in the same category.

**Application** (to receive consideration, the applicant **must** provide a complete application):

1. a resume with name of school, major, work experiences, community services, and awards
2. an official transcript(s) (from the university presently attending) sent from the registrar's office of the university and addressed to Committee Chair (See address below)
3. an essay of professional goals, achievements no more than 500 words with a font size no larger than 12 point Times New Roman and double-spaced
4. any other relevant supporting document(s)

Please request the transcript(s) (#2) be mailed directly to the Committee Chair. The application deadline is July 15. Awardees will be notified before August 15 and **must be present at the Phi Tau Phi's annual meeting in Chicago to receive the award**. Your award letter will indicate the date and location of the annual meeting.
